



## “RST Mobile Seminars” Project, Academy of Moral and Political Sciences, Fiscal Year 2022

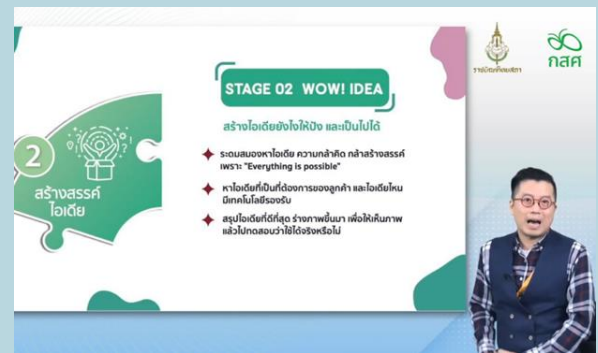
In Fiscal Year 2022, the Academy of Moral and Political Sciences organized a total of 6 seminars under the auspices of the "RST Mobile Seminars" Project, which can be summarized as follows:

1) The Academic Discipline of Education and the Equitable Education Fund (EEF) held an RST Mobile Seminar on June 2, 2022, from 8.30 to 12.00 hrs., as part of the "RST Mobile Seminars" Project, with the theme "Innovation and Technology to Prevent Learning Loss and Increase Learning Gain." A total of 4,485 people participated in this event: 1,900 watched live broadcasts on the RST Office Facebook page, 2,441 watched on the EEF page, and 144 used the Zoom system. Moreover, YouTube EEF thailand was used to provide video recordings of the seminar. Additionally, a special article titled "From Learning Loss to Accelerated Learning Gain: Stop the Time Bomb" was posted on the EEF website, along with a report in Visual Note Format.





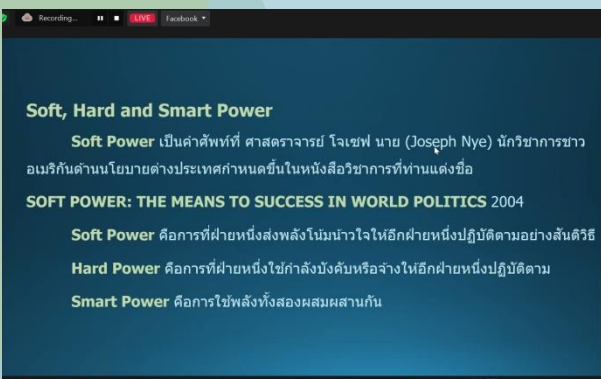
2) The Academic Discipline of Education in conjunction with the Equitable Education Fund (EEF) operated an RST Mobile Seminar on August 4, 2022, from 8.30-12.00 hrs., as part of the "RST Mobile Seminars" Project, with the theme "Educational Transformation to develop Learners as Innovation and Digital Technology Leaders." A total of 3,269 people were interested in attending the seminar: 1,079, 1,259, and 931 attendees via live broadcasts on the RST Office Facebook page, on the EEF Facebook page, and through the Zoom cloud meeting system, respectively. Video recordings of the seminar were made available on YouTube EEF thailand. Additionally, a special article and a report in Visual Note Format were posted on the EEF website.







3) The Branch of Communication Arts in collaboration with the Department of Communication Arts and Management Innovation, National Institute of Development Administration, hosted an RST Mobile Seminar on August 18, 2022, from 8.30-12.00 hrs., with the title “Soft Power: Mediating Thai Identity to the World.” There were 1,370 people participating in the meeting via electronic media and watching the live broadcasts via RST Office Facebook. A total of 1,300 people viewed the live broadcasts via the RST Office Facebook page, while 70 people used the Zoom cloud conference system.





4) The Academic Discipline of Psychology, the Academy of Moral and Political Sciences, operated an RST Mobile Seminar on August 19, 2022, from 8.30-12.00 hrs., with the title “Appropriate adjustment to COVID-19 after it becomes endemic.” There were 30 people attending the meeting via the Zoom cloud meeting system.



5) The Academic Discipline of Social Sciences, the Academy of Moral and Political Sciences, organized an RST Mobile Seminar on August 19, 2022, from 13:30-16:00 hrs., with the title “Inspiring Thailand: Toward a Society of Well-Being and Happiness.” There were 37 people interested in attending the meeting via the Zoom cloud meeting system.

6) The Academic Discipline of History organized an RST Mobile Seminar on August 25, 2022, from 9.00-12.30 hrs., with the title “Learning Process of Using Oral History Methodology for the Study of Local History: Case Studies of the Northern and Northeastern Regions of Thailand.” A total of 3,330 people attending the meeting via electronic media and watching the live broadcasts via RST Office Facebook. To be precise, 3,200 individuals watched the live broadcast via RST Office Facebook, and 130 individuals through the Zoom cloud meeting system.





## “RST Mobile Seminars” Project, Academy of Arts, Fiscal Year 2022



On July 23, 2022, at 8.30 a.m., via a Zoom cloud meeting system, Professor Emeritus Dr. Surapone Virulrak, President of the Royal Society of Thailand presided over the opening ceremony of an RST Mobile Seminar as part of the “RST Mobile Seminars” Project, Fiscal Year 2022, with the theme "Roles of Monks and Women in Buddhist Literature." This event was organized by the Office of Fine Arts to disseminate knowledge and academic work produced by the Fine Arts fellows and associate fellows. This seminar served as a forum for the exchange of ideas and research among the RST fellows, associate fellows, academics, students, and the general public, as well as to use the knowledge gained to create policy suggestions that would be taken into consideration in subsequent years. “Roles of Monks and Women in Theravada and Acaryavada Buddhist Literature” is the topic of this academic seminar, which featured speakers including Assistant Professor Dr. Dhirapat Prapandvidya (FRST), Associate Professor Dr. Samniang Leurmsai (AFRST), and Dr. Anant Laulertvorakul (AFRST). A total of 181 people registered for this event, and as of October 5, 2022, there has also been 6400 viewings and 194 shares.
